

Holy Nights 2018-19

Friday, December 28 & Thursday, January 3, 7:30 pm; and Sunday, January 6, 3:00 pm



At the Christmas Conference of 1923/24, Rudolf Steiner laid the foundation stone for a new mystery center in the hearts of those whose destiny has led them to anthroposophy, in the form of the Foundation Stone Meditation. In the words of René Querido, “No other meditation embodies so fully the content of anthroposophy. . . . It is also a seed, and meditation on its content can lead to the unfolding of new capacities that lie dormant within the human soul. . . . It reveals, in the most succinct form possible, [our] relation to [our] threefold nature and to the macrocosmic Trinity.”

This year the Festivals Group, joining in the worldwide motif suggested by the Goetheanum Leadership, is focusing our Branch observances on this powerful meditation, offering the opportunity to work artistically with speech artist Debbie Spitulnik. We are hosting three Holy Nights events: Two evenings of preparatory readings about the Foundation Stone Meditation will culminate in a **Festival Gathering**, on the afternoon of Three Kings Day, when Debbie will lead us in working with the fourth panel of the meditation. This fourth panel, with its reference to the qualities of the shepherds and kings, can be felt as especially suited to the Holy Nights.
