
Anthroposophical Society – Greater Washington Branch Festivals Group The Season of St. John and the Cycle of the Year

Presentation on Zoom by Mary Stewart Adams: "Conceiving the New Year at St. John's"

In Karl König's lectures *The Mystery of John and the Cycle of the Year,* he offers a beautiful imagination on the Being of the Year (available **here**, reprinted with permission of the König Institute), describing the unique opportunity we have for experiencing this Being each year at the time of Summer Solstice and St. John's. König writes: "*The year is a being . . . [In] truth, every year [has] a new countenance, and it is up to us to see it, to learn to behold and to understand it."*

Mary Stewart Adams will lead us in an exploration of the mystery of the spiritual new year that is as though conceived at St. John's time, and of how we can find evidence of this mystery in the feast days and verses from the *Calendar of the Soul* during the weeks immediately following St. John's.

Mary Stewart Adams is a Star Lore Historian and host of the weekly public radio program and podcast "The Storyteller's Night Sky." Through her research in spiritual science and her education in literary arts, Mary has developed a unique, humanities-based approach to understanding our relationship with the stars. Her work is further augmented by an extensive knowledge of

ancient mythologies and fairy tales, which she relates to the research and ideas of contemporary astronomy in order to understand the new star wisdom of astrosophy.

Mary has traveled extensively in fulfillment of her mission to safeguard the human imagination by protecting our access to the night sky and its stories, and has received numerous honors for her work advocating for dark skies. As a global advocate for starry skies, Mary led the team that established the 9th International Dark Sky Park in the world in 2011, which later led to the State of Michigan protecting 35,000 acres of state land for its natural darkness.

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For this occasion Mary shares the following verse by Rudolf Steiner:

Into depths of soul I will sink Devoted contemplation, so that it grows strong For the true goals of human activity.
